On Thursday, May 8, white smoke billowed from the chimney of the Sistine Chapel, signaling the end of the papal conclave and with it, the election of a new pope. It was announced shortly after, that Robert Prevost, born in Chicago, was elected as the new head of the Catholic Church. His papal name will be Pope Leo XIV.

Mark Carney won the Canadian election being elected the prime minister heading the Liberal party. The liberal party won the election by a vote share of 170 compared to the Conservative party which won 143 seats. This is the fourth straight defeat for the Conservative party in the Canadian elections .

Three eruptions were recorded at Sakurajima volcano in Kagoshima, Japan, on May 15, 2025, with ash plumes reaching heights of over 4200 m (13800 feet) above sea level. Ashfall was reported in Kagoshima City, reducing visibility on city roads. According to Japanese media reports, 25 flights departing from and arriving at Kagoshima Airport were canceled due to the eruption.

Around the world, one Plate at a time – Lamprais, Srilanka



Lamprais is a complex Sri Lankan dish usually consisting of stock-cooked short-grained rice, three meat curry (beef, pork, and lamb), wambatu moju (eggplant pickle), seeni sambol (onion relish), blanchan (shrimp paste), frikadeller meatballs, eggplant and ash plantain curry, while the common addition also includes fried boiled eggs. All the ingredients are placed inside a banana leaf to create a parcel that is then baked in the oven. Traditional versions nowadays often substitute meat curries with other types of meat such as chicken, while fish and vegetable versions are also common. Each component is

cooked separately. The cooked rice, meat curries, vegetables, and accompaniments are mixed and then carefully wrapped in a banana leaf. The parcel is either steamed or baked, allowing the flavours to meld and the banana leaf to infuse the dish with its distinct aroma.

Trade News

Suez Canal offers 15% discount for big container ships to win back trade

Egypt's Suez Canal will offer a 15% discount on transit fees for container ships with net tonnage of at least 130,000 metric tons, to encourage trade back now that the security situation has eased and help ships offset rising insurance costs, its authorities said on Tuesday. The discounts will be applied from May 15 for 90 days on container ships that meet the standards, whether full or empty, Suez Canal Authority said in a statement.

Revenue from the Suez Canal, a key source of foreign currency for Egypt, plunged to \$880.9 million in the fourth quarter of last year from \$2.4 billion a year earlier, following attacks on shipping by Yemen's Houthis in the Red Sea and Bab Al-Mandab Strait. The Iran-backed Houthis say they are trying to shut off cargo bound for Israel in support of Palestinians in Gaza, but they are also chasing ships away from the canal. During Mid-May, Suez Canal Authority chief Osama Rabie met with representatives from shipping agencies who called for temporary incentives that would help offset increased insurance costs for vessels operating in the Red Sea, which they deemed a high-risk zone.

Three air cargo giants join forces to create a global logistics network

Qatar Airways Cargo, IAG Cargo, and MASkargo have announced their intent to launch a global joint business agreement in the air cargo sector, which would pool a fleet of around 1,000 aircraft, including belly cargo capacity on passenger planes. The agreement is subject to approval by the relevant regulatory authorities. If finalized, this strategic partnership will allow the three companies to integrate resources, infrastructure, and expertise to "create a more efficient cargo network with enhanced global connectivity." According to the companies, the agreement will offer a unified product range, improved transit times, new routing options, and harmonized safety and security standards. Qatar Airways Cargo—one of the world's largest cargo divisions—will be a key pillar of the agreement alongside IAG Cargo, the cargo division of International Airlines Group (IAG), which owns British Airways, Iberia, Aer Lingus, Vueling, and LEVEL, and MASkargo, the air cargo subsidiary of the Malaysia Aviation Group. The companies stated that the alliance aims to "enhance the accessibility and efficiency of air freight" in a global logistics landscape increasingly demanding agility and reach. The goal is to "build a truly connected network" that can better adapt to the dynamics of international trade.
